Dress Code Requirement

With the warm weather finally here, the Environmental Health and Safety Department would like to remind Faculty, Staff, and students that, for your personal safety, appropriate attire that covers the entire leg and feet is still required per the University's Chemical Hygiene Program.

As a University of Rochester Employee, it is your responsibility to be dressed for the research and/or clinical laboratory environment. This means wearing clothing and attire appropriate to lab activities, including, but is not limited to: wearing pants that cover the entire leg (no shorts, short skirts, or Capri pants), securing long hair, not wearing clothing that has dangling laces/straps or is loose fitting, not wearing dangling jewelry, and wearing only completely enclosed shoes (no sandals, clogs, crocs, high heels or light-weight slipper shoes).

LAB DECOMISSIONINGS:

Over the years, a number of laboratories have been vacated by Principal Investigators and were found to contain abandoned equipment, chemicals, biological specimens, sharps, radioactive materials, and a variety of waste materials. Those entering these spaces (cleaning staff, contractors, new occupants, etc.) are placed at risk of exposure to unknown agents. To correct these issues, a Laboratory Decommissioning Program has been implemented.

Periodic changes/updates are made to this program as needed. <u>Ultimately, the Principle Investigators and their associated Departments are responsible</u> to adhere to this program. Environmental Health and Safety (EH&S) will construct, implement, and oversee the program. For in-depth information and expectations – see the EHS website for <u>Lab Decommissioning</u>

Institutional Biological Safety Committee reminder:

The NIH Guidelines for Research Involving Recombinant or Synthetic Nucleic Acid Molecules (NIH Guidelines) apply to all University PI's, even if they do not receive NIH funding. Do you need a refresher, or just a quick place to go, for what requires Institutional Biosafety Committee (IBC) approval? The IBC has a one page, "IBC quick reference, (updated 6/2018)"
